I have been upset, shocked and tearful at some points this week watching the news with my family. Sad as I know many of you will have been watching events unfold across the globe in protest of what happened to George Floyd. George Floyd mattered. He was loved. His family was important. His life mattered.

As you know I speak my mind. I write to you all as I always do from the heart and honestly.

Prejudice and inequality exists. It isn't acceptable. Racism exists. At Jennett's Park we have a very clear equality policy, anti-bullying policy and behaviour approach. It would be naive to think that even with that and our strong sense of shared values that people don't suffer from discrimination in our community. We actively state that we as a school will do all we can to combat discrimination against pupils or their families because of their sex, race, disability, religion or belief and sexual orientation. Protection is extended those who are pregnant or undergoing gender reassignment.

'Central to our Christian theology is the truth that every single one of us is made in the image of God. Every one of us is loved unconditionally by God. We must avoid, at all costs, diminishing the dignity of any individual to a stereotype or a problem. In our discussions there are real concerns relating to the disproportionately negative impact that Covid-19 is having on BAME men and women, especially those from the black and Bangladeshi community. We will actively risk assess for this for staff, children and family who come on site.

If you are suffering or discriminated against we're here for you in whatever you may need. If you think there is a way we can adjust our work in school let us know. If you are impacted in any way, reach out we'll try to help. We recognise we need to make a stand.

Dear Parents and Carers,


We are ready with our plans for staggered reopening. Thank you to everyone who has been so supportive and helpful in their return to school conversations.

New at Home Learning offer for SEE SAW https://web.seesaw.me/



We want to offer a new way to help those at home. In addition to everything we do we will now wider our offer.

Seesaw is an app that allows children to photograph or video their work and upload it in a safe and secure way to virtual classrooms that teachers can access. We have researched several options and feel that Seesaw provides everything we need in a simple, clear manner. Like all of this style of app, Seesaw has many functions including allowing teachers to post lessons and video call students however, we will need to roll out the functionality slowly to ensure that nobody - children, parents or teachers - is overwhelmed by the workload.

To begin with, the idea is that each child could upload one piece of work a week connected to the weekly learning topics that are on our website or sent out as our work packs and teachers will access and respond to their learning. As you are aware, the current Government guidelines regarding opening schools means that staff are working extremely hard to create a safe environment for children to return to school.

This means that teachers are working in a different way right now so, just as your child may return to school to be taught by an adult they don't usually have, the uploaded work may be responded to by a different adult than their class teacher.

So what happens next? Well the app is free to download for families but requires setting up from the school as we have to provide you with login details. There are links to video tutorials on how to use the app that we will send out with the login details - some of the functionality can look a little daunting to begin with but remember, we are starting small and building up confidence for all users.
