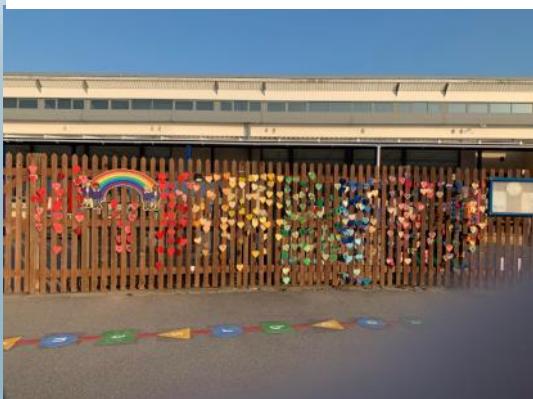

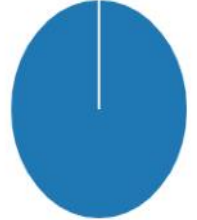
Thank you for your thoughts on the parent questionnaires.

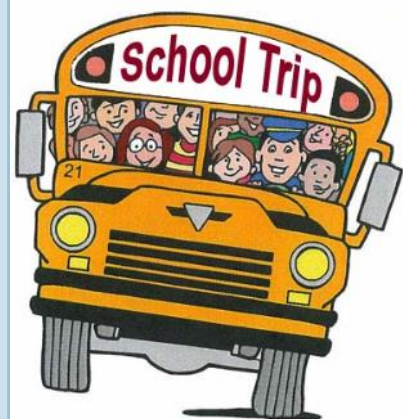

As we come to the end of another year it was fantastic to have so many trips and visits restart. We will look to the suggestions of future adaptations and suggestions from children, staff and parents. In total this year there were over 36 trips externally and a similar number internally.

One change we will make now is reverting to pay as we go on trips. We initiated £35 upfront to reduce bureaucracy and chasing - some parents preferred this, but some have felt the chasing too demanding. We cannot run trips without donations.

Thank you to the several anonymous donors in our community who have very generously closed the gap on trips. Their contributions have significantly helped for trips to go ahead. You are marvellous rainbows helping our community. We will continue to subsidise those in hardship- those with pupil premium or any other hardship please contact us via the office.
