## **Dear Parents and Carers,**

Lots of updates this week. Enjoy our reports on Living life in all its fullness.

Attendance— as we return to more normality please be aware of these startling facts. Your child's attendance at school is an important factor on the results they may be able to achieve as they progress through their education.



Our teachers can't teach children who have not come to school! The table below shows just how much impact time off can have, the lower the attendance, the harder it is to catch up with peers. We expect children in school every day unless illness prevents this, help us to help your children and keep giving your children the best chance to succeed in school!

96%-100% attend- ance	Your child has the best chance of success!	Good. Your child is able to take full advantage of every learning opportunity offered to them!
90-95% attend- ance	Your child has missed at least 2 weeks of learning, that could be 10 literacy lessons and 10 maths lessons.	Requires improvement. Your child has missed a significant amount of learning and will have to work hard to catch up and avoid gaps in their knowledge,
85%-89% attend- ance	Your child has missed at least 4 weeks of learning, that could be 20 literacy lessons and 20 maths lessons.	Unsatisfactory. Your child is now at risk of underachieving. They will need extra support from you ta catch up on missed work.
80%-84% attend- ance	Your child has missed at least 5 ½ weeks of learning, that could be around 30 literacy lessons and 30 maths lessons.	Poor. Your child's poor attendance has had a significant impact on their learning and they will find it hard to catch up. These gaps in their learning are likely to cause them difficulties as they continue their learning in following years.
Below 80% at- tendance	Your child has missed at least 7 weeks of learning, that is more than a whole term's worth of maths and literacy.	Inadequate. Your child is missing out on their education. They will now struggle to catch up without significant additional support from home.


