## Home Learning

- To foster independence, it is your child's responsibility to return it to the correct box when they arrive on the Tuesday.

# Reading

- · Each child has a reading book which should be read daily.
- They should place it in the relevant basket at the start of every day 'I would like to keep reading my book' or 'I would like to change my
  book'.
- The expectation for Year 2 reading is more about comprehension than just decoding (Year 1).
- When you have heard your child read, please sign their reading record.
- If your child has left their reading book at school, you can hear them read a book from home or a library book. Please sign this in their reading record as well.

## PE Days

- Tuesdays and Fridays every week.
- In Year 2, the PE kit will not need to be washed every week.
- Ideally, if kit can be left here for the half term, it is less likely to be forgotten.
- Make sure your child has suitable trainers and clothing suited for outdoor use, particularly in the winter months.

# Spelling

- A spelling bee list will be sent out each Friday to be returned and tested the following Thursday.
- It follows a look, say, cover, write, check format. There is an additional application part for the children to use and apply the words within sentences.
- If your child is unsure about what the word means, a great way to share some new learning would be to have a look in a dictionary together.
- There is an internal school competition to see which KS1 class can be the champion spellers!
