Thank you to everyone who has fed back about the positive dropping off. This email is to address concerns some have on some families displaying a lack of spacing at pick up. Gates open at 2:55 for a smooth collection. Similar to morning sessions you do not have to be immediate at end of day – we understand that spacing is the most important issue. We will close gates at 3:15 but someone is always in the office to help if you are late.

We do not expect face coverings at the moment, but may introduce these as have other schools if people are unable to socially distance.

Please follow these four points to keep us safe as a community:

- 1) Leave a space between yourself and other groups of adults**
- 2) Only bring one person onto site. There are a few exemptions for those parents who need extra care for those with special needs. I will remind parents tonight then expect this from Thursday morning.**
- 3) Keep children with you.**
- 4) Collect quickly and leave. Standing to discuss issues with parents is creating jam points outside of gates and some classes.**

I will ask senior members of my team to monitor this this week and remind people to adhere to the rules. If you feel comfortable reminding others then please feel free to do so , but if not please approach a staff member who can sensitively tackle those who need reminding.

COVID, COLDS, COUGHS AND COLLYWOBBLES

Just a note to clarify symptoms and procedures that school are following in line with the government and public health advise.

If any child has anyone of the symptoms below they will be sent home:

- A) A temperature above 37.5 - **staff will take child's temperature a few times before** contacting the parent.
- B) A new continuous barking cough
- C) If your child coughs 3 times or more in an hour
- D) A loss of, or change to, sense of smell or taste

If your child is not feeling well **please do not** send them to school. We ask that you monitor symptoms and if they do not have a temperature (or any if the above symptoms) and feeling better they are able to return to school. If they have any of the above then they must be tested before they return school.

Please be assured we are not doing this to be awkward but to ensure the safety of our community as a whole.

NASA's 'International Observe the moon day 2020' which takes place tomorrow 26th September.

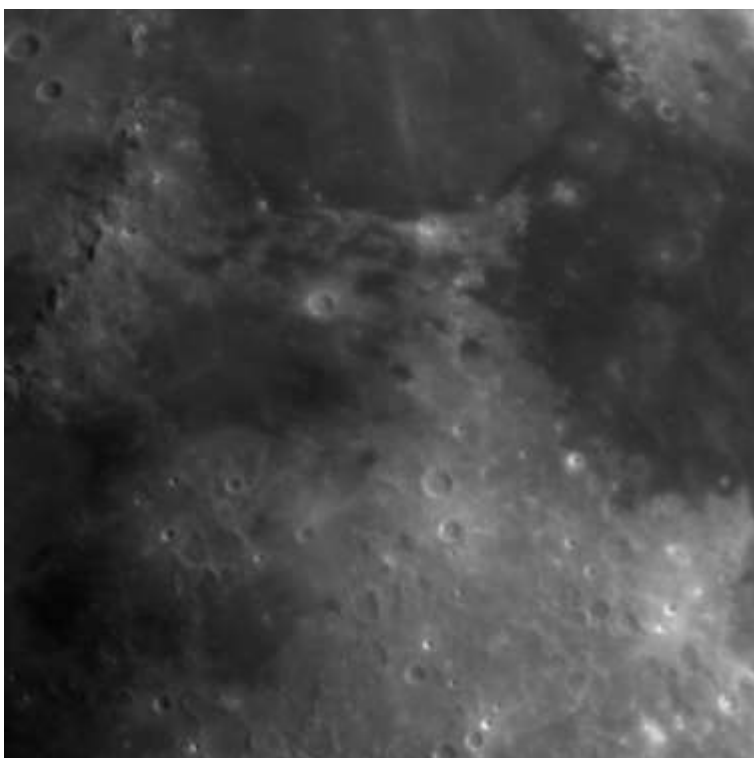

It looks (according to current weather) like it may be cloudy though, but the moon may be visible though gaps in the clouds. however, you can observe the moon over the next month to see how it changes day by day.

Matthew Webb observed the moon using the Liverpool telescope in the Canary islands over lockdown and attached are some great shots of the moon's mountains and ranges.



There is also an ISS (International space station) fly over at 19:56 tonight on 25th Sep until 20:02.. look for a fast moving bright dot going west to east. and another at 21:33 until 21:35 both times have minimal cloud cover according to Matthew, so there should be very good views of it!!

**Covid-19 related pupil absence
A quick reference guide for parents**

What to do if	Action Needed	Return to school when.....
My Child has Covid-19 symptoms: • HIGH TEMPERATURE – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back. • A NEW CONTINUOUS COUGH – this means coughing a lot more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24hrs. • A LOSS OR CHANGE TO YOUR SENSE OF SMELL OR TASTE – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything.	DO NOT COME TO SCHOOL Contact school to inform us. Self-isolate the whole household for 14 days. Get a test. INFORM SCHOOL IMMEDIATELY ABOUT TEST RESULTThe test comes back negative
My Child tests positive for covid-19.....	DO NOT COME TO SCHOOL Contact school to inform us. Agree an earliest date for possible return. Minimum of 10 days. Self-isolate the whole household for 14 days. Bubble isolates/remote learning.They feel better. They can return after 10 days even if they have a cough or loss of taste/smell. These symptoms can last for several weeks.
My Child tests negative	CONTACT THE SCHOOL Discuss when your child can come back to school (same day/next day)The test comes back negative.
My child is ill with symptoms not linked to covid-19	FOLLOW USUAL SCHOOL ABSENCE POLICY PROCEDURE	After 48hrs following the last bout of sickness/diarrhoea if this is the cause of absence
Someone in my household has covid-19 symptoms	DO NOT COME TO SCHOOL Contact school. Self-isolate the whole household for 14 days. Household members to get tested. INFORM SCHOOL IMMEDIATELY ABOUT TEST RESULTSThe test comes back negative.
Someone in my household tests positive for covid-19	DO NOT COME TO SCHOOL Contact school. Agree an earliest date for possible return. Minimum of 14 daysThe child has completed 14 days of isolation
NHS test & trace has identified my child has been in close contact of someone with symptoms of confirmed covid-19	DO NOT COME TO SCHOOL. CONTACT SCHOOL Agree an earliest date for possible return. Minimum of 14 daysThe child has completed 14 days of isolation
We/my child has travelled and has to self-isolate as a period of quarantine.	Do not take unauthorised leave in term time. Consider quarantine requirements and FCO advice when booking travel. Returning from a destination where quarantine is needed. Agree an earliest date for possible return. Minimum of 14 days from return date. Self-isolate the whole household.The quarantine period of 14 days has been completed
We have received medical advice that my child must resume shielding	DO NOT COME TO SCHOOL. CONTACT SCHOOL Shield until you are informed that restrictions are lifted and shielding is paused again.School inform you that restrictions have been lifted and your child can return to school.
My child's bubble is closed due to a covid-19 outbreak in school.	DO NOT COME TO SCHOOL. At home support your child with remote education provided by school. Your child will need to isolate for 14 days.School will inform you when the bubble will be reopened.
