Our School



Our Curriculum

We believe it is important for our children to develop a love of learning, an enthusiasm for knowledge and a confidence to share their ideas and thoughts with others around them. To help in this our curriculum is creative and diverse encouraging an active engagement in the children's' own learning and a respect for the rights of others to learn.

Early Years Foundation Stage

Our Nursery and Reception classes work closely together creating opportunities for the children to become well-rounded individuals who love school and are confident coming into the classroom and exploring learning through the four prime areas of learning:

- Personal
- Social and Emotional Development
- Communication and Language
- Physical Development

and also the four specific areas of learning:

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design

from the Early Years Framework and Guidance.





Key Stage 1 & 2

From Years 1 - 6, we follow the 2014 National Curriculum, offering our children a broad and balanced curriculum, whilst maintaining a focus on developing key English and Maths skills.

Our teachers plan a range of exciting lessons that develop children's knowledge, understanding and basic skills alongside promoting their spiritual, moral, social and cultural development.

Phonics & Reading Schemes

From Nursery we teach the Read Write Inc approach to Phonics. This is taken further into Key Stage 1 to ensure that we have a consistent approach to developing reading and writing across the school.

Reading is consistently a key priority for our school, every child reads either individually, through small guided reading groups or whole class reading sessions each day following the Oxford Reading Tree scheme and Read Write Inc schemes for Reading.

Outdoor Learning

We are very fortunate to have beautiful grounds for our children to thrive in.

Our outdoor environment is an integral learning space for our Early Years Nursery and Reception classes and we encourage our children to be learning outside in all weathers. Our children take great pride in all aspects of our learning space from our Mary's garden, story telling chair, Orienteering stations, Daily Mile track, outdoor gym and the wooden stages around the playgrounds which are used for outdoor role plays.





Expectations and Celebration

We expect our children to do their very best at school. We expect them to behave well, demonstrate our values, be responsible, take their place in both the school and wider communities and be punctual in attendance. Staff and parents work together to make sure that any instances where our children do not meet expectations are dealt with fairly, compassionately and so that our children can learn for the future.

The school has an active School Council and we make sure that age-relevant roles of responsibility are given to those children voted into the position by their peers so that they can play a key role and have a voice in our school's development.

Achievement at school and at home are always commended at our weekly Celebration Assemblies run by our older children. These assemblies are our opportunity to applaud the academic, sporting and altruistic efforts of our children.

Starting School

Starting school is an exciting and important time for both you and your child. We want to make the transition as smooth and rewarding as possible and so will work with you as a parent to make sure your child feels as confident and as happy as possible as they embark on this new chapter.

Nursery Admissions

Our Nursery provision offers 52 part time places, either mornings or afternoons, to children who are aged 3 and above. Places are available for children from the term after they turn 3 until they reach school age.

Main School Admission

For children who would be due to enter the main school please refer to our Admissions policy for more information on how admissions are dealt with.

For families of children due to start in Reception once you have been offered and accepted a place, you will be sent a pack of information including some key dates for meetings where you as a parent can find out more about starting school, meet staff and ask questions. We will this at this time also organise a series of visits for your child to come and join in their new class.

These visits and our staggered start programme in September are specifically designed to support your child while they familiarise themselves with the classroom, other children and staff they will be working with.

Our School Day

In a normal school year, our children all enter and leave school through their classroom doors from the playground, this gives parents and staff the opportunity to speak about any issues or successes that need highlighting.

Morning: 8.50 - 12.00pm (Main School)

8.45 - 11.45am (Nursery)

Afternoon: 1.00 - 3.20pm (Reception & KS1)

1.00 - 3.25pm (KS2)

12.30 - 3.30pm (Nursery)



Punctuality is a key focus for our school, children who regularly arrive late miss out on the start of lessons as well as interrupting the learning of others in the class.



Extra-Curricular Activities

We aim to provide a stimulating and enriching environment and this includes offering a range of after-school activities and organising class trips.

Our after-school activities are a combination of paid for clubs provided by external companies and free school led clubs ran voluntarily by staff members. Details of these clubs are sent home at the beginning of each term.

Trips are organised for each class from Reception upwards and are designed to support the curriculum topics your child is learning about. Residential trips are offered to our oldest children.

Working Together - Your Role in Learning

As key educators in your children's lives, we understand that it is important that you feel you have a voice and that as a school we are approachable and allocate time to listen to your concerns, worries or thoughts about the school.

Parents and carers are key to the education of their children. A child will make better progress at school when there is good co-operation and respect between parents and school.

Consultation meetings are held with parents in the Autumn and Spring terms and during the Summer term a written report is sent home and parents are given an opportunity to discuss this report with class teachers.

To help you support your children as they learn, we run regular subject sessions to show how we teach and offer ideas on how to continue the learning at home.

We encourage parents and carers to spend time with their child each day to help consolidate the learning that has happened in school and, as a school, we are committed to homework being given during the week.

We actively encourage parents and carers to come into school and help the learning in the classroom - although we appreciate that not everyone is available to do this.





During Covid

As is apparent from our lack of ability to offer tours this year, we have all as a school community had to quickly adapt to the new world we are living in and our children are learning in.

Throughout lockdown our staff worked hard to make sure that all our families were supported as much as possible including letters and videos to the children, workbooks for home learning, support from our Education Psychologist and our Family Support Worker, weekly based themes for window decorations, virtual choir and playgrounds for each year.

We were also proud that we remained open throughout for all keyworker children including through Easter and half term and were able to welcome back so many of our children into Nursery, Reception, Year 1, Year 6 and some sessions for our Year 5 children.



Since our children fully returned to school in September we have focussed on a Recovery Curriculum that has allowed us to prioritise the well-being of our whole community of children and staff. Routines have been re-established, children have been given time to talk and build relationships with peers and staff so that they feel safe and are ready to learn.

Equal Opportunities

As such we have a duty to be watchful for signs and symptom of: abuse whether it is emotional, physical or sexual or if we suspect neglect. With urgent and/or repeated incidents, the school is obliged to refer these to other agencies.

Please be assured that your child's safety and well-being are our first concern. The Head teacher, Mrs Savage, is the Designated Teacher responsible for the implementation of Child Protection Procedures.
