<u>COVID, COLDS, COUGHS AND COLLYWOBBLES</u>

Just a note to clarify symptoms and procedures that school are following in line with the government and public health advise.

If any child has anyone of the symptoms below they will be sent home:

- A) A temperature above 37.5 staff will take child's temperature a few times before contacting the parent.
- B) A new continuous barking cough
- C) If your child coughs 3 times or more in an hour
- D) A loss of, or change to, sense of smell or taste

If your child is not feeling well please do not send them to school. We ask that you monitor symptoms and if they do not have a temperature (or any if the above symptoms) and feeling better they are able to return to school. If they have any of the above then they must be tested before they return school.

Please be assured we are not doing this to be awkward but to ensure the safety of our community as a whole.

In June this year a telephone support line was set up as an additional service so that despite Covid 19 restrictions in our schools children, young people and their families could still access health advice, support and signposting from the school nurse. Although initially a response to the Covid pandemic, this initiative has proved popular and in response to feedback from our service users is planned to continue. Following the initial call, if it is felt necessary by the caller and nurse, a referral into our service is made to offer ongoing targeted support. Since the launch of this new initiative, we have received an increasing number of calls as awareness of the line has improved.

Love in my heart.


Today I feel happy
