It has been a real pleasure to begin to get to know your children at the start of the term. We have some lovely, caring characters who are ready for the challenges ahead in Year 2.



The Great Fire of London!

This term we will be basing our learning around the theme of 'The Great Fire of London!' We are also building the children's wellbeing and establishing owl learning behaviours alongside the rainbow promise. We are also establishing deeper phonics knowledge and application within reading and writing as well as building their confidence in the subjects.

We will learn about The Great Fire through research using Samuel Pepys' diary from this period in history. The children will find out how the fire started, how it spread, and what happened afterwards. They will also be developing their Art and DT skills to create versions of the Great Fire of London using mixed media.
