Name of Unit Through the wardrobe

The Context (Why): Use of a fantasy setting to create a vehicle of imaginative language and writing. Go through the wardrobe into the world and discover Europe.

They need to know and understand:

How to explore and express their imagination.
 Ability to communicate ideas effectively.
 Understand structure and sequence of a story.
 Use of observational skills- explore settings with their senses.
 Knowledge and understanding of grammar, spelling and punctuation.
 Create problems and solve them within a story.
 Build suspense through creative use of language.
 Develop characters, looking at description of behaviours and thoughts as well as looks.
 Use of varied sentence openers for effect.
 Use of expanded noun phrases.
 Understand the countries and capital cities of Europe.

Educating for Wisdom, Knowledge and Skills	To help grow resourceful, resilient and reflective children who are equipped with the skills, knowledge and tenacity empower themselves, their learning throughout their lives.

The Challenge or Big Questions

 How far has my food travelled?

Real life context and links to Wider World (International/ Charity/ World of Work)

UK/European produce - food origins/ food miles- pollution/ global warming.
 World of work- where our food come from- growers, transporters, factory, shop etc

Activities (Possible Route of learning)

1. Explore characters through role play and hot seating.
2. Shoe box wardrobe settings.
3. Winter soup using UK grown food only.
4. Writing food poems
5. Sharing our new stories with another year group
6. Year group assembly.

Trips/ Visits / Experiences

Possible Narnia Day- dress up as any character from the story
 Prince/ princess, animals, white queen, Aslan, fairies, trees etc.

Challenge 10 activities

Check in line up activity to assess knowledge at start and end of learning.

Visual imagery- photos of artefacts to compare and use questions to develop thinking skills
