


Dear Parents and Carers,


Dear God,

You can return your library items in one of our drop boxes. We have letter boxes at the following libraries: Ascot Heath, Bracknell, Birch Hill, Binfield (side door),


Crowthorne and Great Hollands.

Read Write Inc. Reading book change

We are pleased to be able to offer weekly reading book changes to all children in Early Years, Year 1 and those in Year 2 who are usually taking home Read Write Inc. books. If you aren't sure if this includes you, please contact your class teacher to find out. The system will be run similarly to a supermarket click and collect with minimal contact to allow for social distancing.

How can I get my phonics reading book changed?

A post will be released via Tapestry/Seesaw on Monday asking you to make us aware if you need a book change.

Respond to the above post telling us which colour/stage book your child is on and the current book you have at home. The post will be closed Tuesday 9am (EYFS) Wednesday 9am (Year 1 and 2), if you request a book after this time it will not be included.

Books clearly labelled with each child's name will be available to collect from a table outside the main school gate on Tuesday morning from 9:30 (EYFS) and Wednesday 10:30 (Year 1 and 2) for an hour.

When collecting please remember to bring your current book to return and place in the quarantine book box at the table.

In order to keep every safe, collection and book exchange will be contactless and not an opportunity to discuss you child's reading. Any questions or comments on your child's reading must still be communicated through a phone call to the office, or through your learning platform, Tapestry/Seesaw.

Reading

We know that reading at home, and getting access to books, can be tricky at times, let alone in these circumstances. Consequently, we have signed each class up to **getepic.com**, which has a range of free books available for the children to read online. This is available on the computer, or via an app for phones or tablets.

Between the hours of 9-4 the children can read as much as they like, for free! Beyond this time, they can read for up to two hours, at no cost.

There are a range of books, from stories, to non-fiction, to poetry, read-alouds, audio-books and even books in other languages so you can practise your French and Spanish!

You can also search for the books by age, to help your child continue selecting challenging books- which should be a text that has about 2-3 words on each page that the child doesn't know. Within these books, your child can click on the word that they don't understand and it will explain the meaning!
