Reading: It is expected that all children in Year 3 read at home at least 3 times a week and that this is recorded in their planner by an adult. In order to foster independence in the children, we do not check their planners every day. Therefore, if any comments from home have been written in their planners, the children will be expected to give us their planners in order for us to view the comments. The children are expected to bring their reading books and planners into school every day. Reading books and library books will be changed on a weekly basis.

Spelling: This term will see the recommencement of the weekly spelling bee tests. This is something we have decided as a year group to continue. These will be handed out on a Friday as well as uploaded to Seesaw and will be tested the following Thursday.

Home learning: Literacy and maths home learning will be uploaded onto Seesaw on alternate weeks, and will be linked to our weekly learning or skills that need to be practised.

PE: Our PE day each week is Wednesday. On these days, the children are expected to come into school wearing full PE kit. This includes appropriate footwear, preferably trainers.

Our topic this term is 'Vikings and Dragons', which we are already very excited about! Earlier this week we made dragon eggs out of clay and decorated them with paint and gems.
