Thank you to all who answered our questionnaire. Your thoughts were really helpful. You commented that you would alongside having the staff who knew the children and were well trained:

- Like a range of activities including sports
- Did not mind if breakfast was served
- Wanted it priced lower per hour than existing charges
- Wanted to pay with Childcare vouchers if at all possible
- That you didn't want it open to children outside of school
- To have better flexibility and understanding of last minute changes ie not be charged a term at a time/ late charges/ cancellations for things out of your control
- For us to look after children younger than 5

We won't have all of these ready until our full running of clubs in September but gradually will introduce many of these elements.

We have modelled our future provision on the rooms style set up where children come to sign in have breakfast/ snack if they wish then go to different activities—craft/ reading/ art/ gardening/ soft play/ sports. This is obviously harder to run under full COVID restrictions so we won't introduce this fully until September.

We are delighted that Ms Whittington our HLTA will run this club and gradually we will employ more staff. Many London clubs host up to 150 children a day—the more come the wider the activities on offer to start the day with a chance to be better equipped for learning.

Jennett's Park Breakfast club started officially on Tuesday 4th May at JPCE. Our booking and payment system is up and running now. Book your places via sQuid by 3pm the day before. We have initially 8 spaces. This will grow. We will have a waiting list.

At the moment we are only placing for those aged 5 and above in Jennett's Park. We have decided to price the hourly session at £3 so a full session of 7:15—8:45 is £4.50.

Please send your child in with a snack as for the moment we won't be serving breakfast. We will look at a snack shop pricing in the new year.

Future changes

- Stock and staff for each exciting new 'room' so eventually we can have as many wanting to come to begin the day as they wish.
- We will introduce later sports clubs running from 8am—8:45 for an energetic start to the day
- •In the future we will introduce part session payments with prices paid for a later session.
- We will explore using childcare vouchers for payment (this is less flexible by design but we will try to be as understanding as possible)
- Explore how to staff for a younger room aged 3 and above.

How big can you grow yours?

- Grow your sunflower from 31st May until 1st September (you can submit your max height sooner than this if needed)
- 2. Take a photo with the measurement next to it, showing your sunflower's max height & send it to office@jacoutreach.org FAO: SUNSHINE
- 3. Results to be in by midnight 1st September.
- 4. Winners announced 10th September

How to grow a Sunflower

- 1. Fill your pot 2/3 full of compost
- 2. Poke a hole in the centre with your finger or a stick
- 3. Pop 1 seed per pot into the hole
- 4. Cover over with more compost.
- 5. Give them a good drink of water.
- Once big enough you can carefully transplant them to a bigger pot or in the ground.

Some growing tips

- Be careful, as slugs and snails like to eat the new shoots. You may like to protect the seedlings by cutting the top off a plastic bottle and placing it over your seedlings.
- To get as much height as you can, it's best to transplant your seedling into the ground.
- You may need to support your sunflower as it grows.

Want to do some more?

- You can create your own labels out of old yogurt pots or tubs. Cut out a marker with scissors (you may need to get an adult to help) and label it up with a pen, or even decorate it!
- Create your own growth chart. Can you keep track of how tall your sunflower is?

Facts on sunflowers

Sunflowers are actually "sun followers" Their buds and blossoms start the day facing east and then follow the sun until it sets in the west.

- About six to eight hours of sunlight are needed for sunflowers to grow well. As if reaching for the skies, some sunflower plants can grow as tall as 16 feet!
- In some cultures, sunflowers are used for healing properties.
