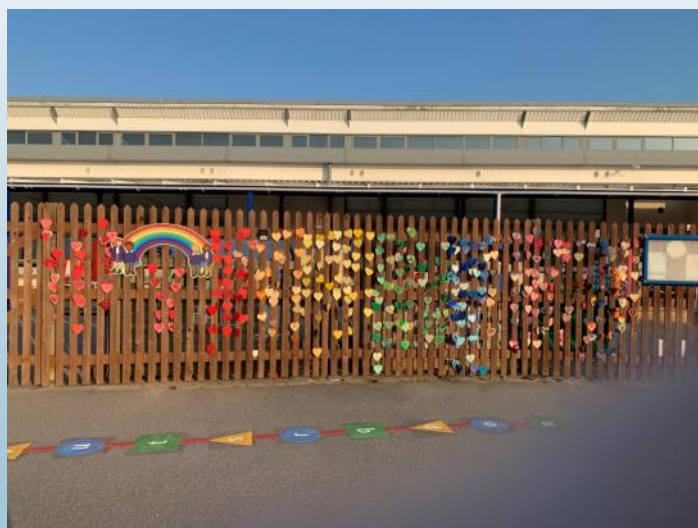

Dear Parents and Carers,

With so much uncertainty on reopening on 21st June nationally we can't announce for definite our plans for PTA fair, Open Evening, Sports day and 10th celebration. We will be ready to tell you those plans key safety factors *IF* the government asks us to defer plans past the 21st. The proposed dates are in the calendar for you to pencil in *BUT* nothing is set in stone yet. We've indicated with a **** those items we hope to invite you to in some reduced form or another.

Thursday and Friday is our 20p fair run by Year 6. Please send in children with 20ps or other money and they will be swapped for covid safe tokens. More details out via Seesaw and Tapestry.

One plan that is in place is for us to get your children to meet their new teachers on a full morning with them. This should ease the 'fear' that some have of waiting to meet new class teachers in September. We are then as always around now looking to balance some classes. As a 2 form school we have the advantage to do this. So you know our rationale for swapping and adjusting please see the following page- these guides were developed by Parent forum with us a few years ago and adjusted for COVID. We never swap individuals without consultation to you, but ultimately class mixing in school is a school led choice. We may choose to do a whole year group rejig. We never plan to change UNLESS there is a need. Please trust us that if we instigate the swap we have considered all reasons why and why not to move.

To help children please do talk to your children about the changes they might have moving years in a positive way and also discretely discuss with them who they learn best with and who they may struggle with. If your child has a very strong voice on this as always please let the teacher know discretely for their consideration. Please remember we only have two classes though and cannot accommodate every combination!

After talking listening to suggestions from parents one new way we will help with communication is to let you know before the transition morning who their class teachers are. This way you don't have to wait until reports to find the swap. David Page and Carla Szadowski (Deputy Headteachers) will ring and liaise with any parents who have individual children involved in class changes. If you are concerned Mrs Thorpe the family support worker can talk you through ideas, as can the Phase leaders.

Pause Day 21st May 2021

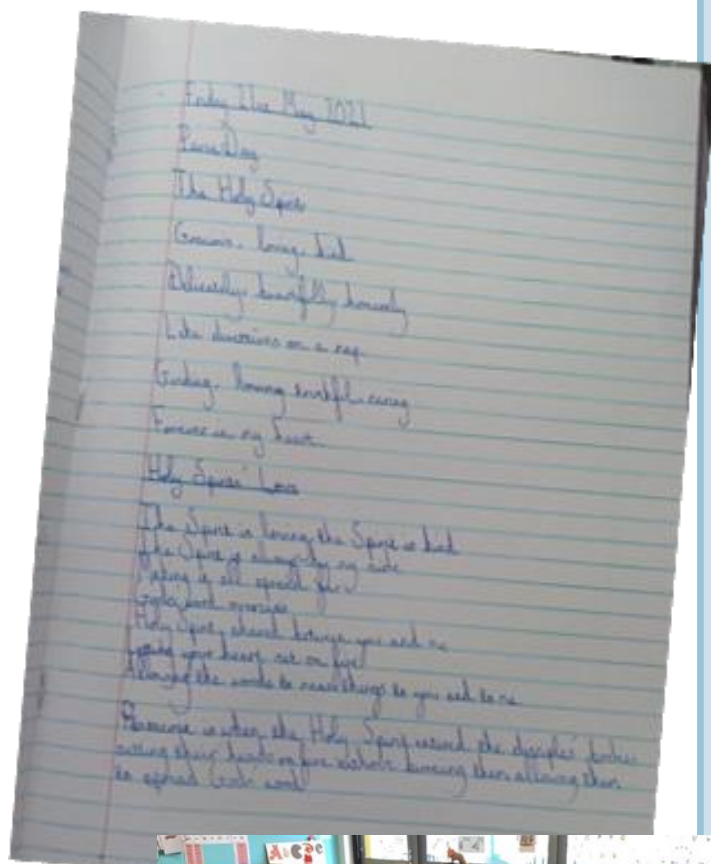
The purpose of a 'Pause Day' is to give children an opportunity to stop and reflect during an 'off-timetable' Religious Education day.

SUMMER READING CHALLENGE

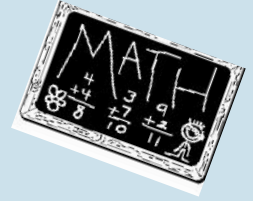
