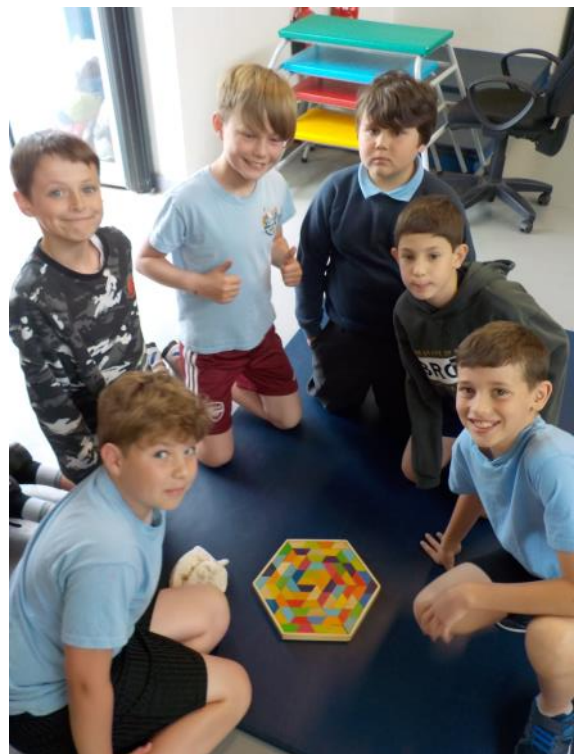
Puzzle Day

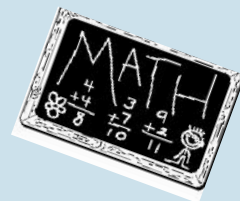
