#### **Dear Parents and Carers,**

Please read the letter about late start on Monday for those who need it. <u>Late-start-Monday-for-those-who-wish-it.pdf (bonitas.org.uk)</u>

I know the announcement to some of the lifting of lockdown restrictions has left some jubilant and some nervous in our community. I, like many in the teaching profession still are processing what that will mean for us and can see many eventualities play out. I'm delighted that there will be no legal restrictions enforcing bubbles, but look to see what we will need to do if an outbreak occurs.

#### Details so far:

- We won't insist on the one way system as of September. Enjoy!
- We won't insist on masks on site outside. If inside in poorly ventilated areas out of courtesy
  we'd ask you to wear one.
- We will continue to inform you if a significant number of children/ staff need to isolate , but not every case nor as is existing specifics of WHO is ill
- We won't close whole bubbles
- We will continue the morning quick drop off with one front gate and carpark gates.
- We will continue with just two gates open at end of day.

Risk assessment—this will follow.


