Dear Parents and Carers,

As part of 'why we are woven together' the next page shows our First languages and Ethnicities as graphs—we have over 25 first languages and many dual speakers—those super talented Advanced Bi—Lingual Students . It is part of the promises we make to our community that we educate for a global community as well as to our local one.



We have come to the end of our month of celebrating **British culture and Black history**. Never fear, for those who feel that it may not be fully entwined, it is brought throughout the curriculum in many ways and then re- celebrated at points across the year. Tolerance, empathy and respect are themes we connect with in our lives under the Rainbow Promise and the hope to be woven together as a community. The next few pages are a sharing of some of the work we have done in school.

This past year has given us time to pause and think about what we value. On talking to the school council they wanted to extend the message to everyone that if a child is found to have been racist, sexist , used a person's religion or sexual orientation against them to make someone feel upset or to win an argument they should have consequences and their parents informed. We have done this for the past four years but they wished to say it again: the consequences they have chosen are in groups of three, so initially three breaks missed, then if repeated three lunchtimes missed, then three mornings internal exclusion, three days internal exclusion , then three mornings then three whole days external exclusion. We would look to move to building to a permanent exclusion past this. There is no excuse to tolerate discrimination in any form in our school or indeed in life in Modern Britain.
