Homework:

All homework is sent out on Seesaw. If you have trouble accessing this, please let a member of staff know.

Spellings: Over the year, we are expecting children to learn the statutory spellings that will be posted on Seesaw.

Maths: TT rockstars at least 3 x week for 15 minutes a time. If your child cannot remember their login, please let us know. We also send out the Roger Challenge weekly, which the children should be practise, to consolidate their number sense.

Reading: Your child will be expected to read for a minimum of 15 minutes a day, 4 days a week. They should post a weekly video of them reading aloud on Seesaw (which can be either their echo read, or their reading book), and we will be posting a reading comprehension once a week on Seesaw. In addition, there are reading comprehension questions linked the children's books that they are reading– one of these should be answered each week.

<u>P.E</u> Our PE afternoon will be moved to Tuesday afternoons. Please can children come to school in their PE kit. We will be outside for this, so please do wear layers.

<u>Curriculum</u>

As mentioned, our topic this term is World War One. This will be linking across the majority of our subjects. Within geography, we will be investigating the positions of the countries involved in World War One, using atlases, as well as studying the effect on the First World War in America, with a focus on several of their key states, such as where these are located in America, their physical and human features, and why these states were important in the war.

We will be studying the war artist, Percy Wyndham Lewis, and experimenting with his style of art, known as vorticism, and how this style evolved throughout his life.
