

With this in mind we would like to launch a **poster competition**! Can you create a poster





## EMERGEADOCOCY

#### Young People's Mental Health & Crisis: Insight and Interventions for Parents

Emerge's team works with young people attending A&E because of self-harm, emotional crisis and suicidal thoughts. Having spoken with many families with young people in A&E, we have designed this training to give parents insight into these issues, equipping them to help their young people cope better, in order to avoid problems reaching crisis point.

#### Session Content:

The Umbrella Model: How harmful coping strategies evolve, why 'just stopping' doesn't work, and finding creative, healthier ways of coping.

**Helpful Adults**: What parents can do to maintain trust and openness with their young people.

**Sources of Support**: Understand the role of NHS mental health services and learn about additional options for support.

The Self-Harm Continuum: Understanding the underlying motivations and roles of selfharming behaviours.

**Drama vs Empowerment**: How to avoid unhealthy relationship dynamics and shift towards a united approach.

Your next steps: A chance to reflect on what you're taking away from the course.

# St Francis & St Clare Church of England | Jennett's Park



# St Francis & St Clare Church of England | Jennett's Park

#### THE GOSPEL St Luke 20:27-38

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. Luke. + Glory to you, O Lord.

<sup>27</sup> Some Sadducees came to Jesus. (Sadducees believe that people will not rise from death.) They asked, <sup>28</sup> "Teacher, Moses wrote that a man's brother might die. He leaves a wife but no children. Then that man must marry the widow and have children for his dead brother. <sup>29</sup> One time there were seven brothers. The first brother married, but died. He had no children. <sup>30</sup> Then the second brother married the widow, and he died. <sup>31</sup> And the third brother married the widow, and he died. The same thing happened with all the other brothers. They all died and had no children. <sup>32</sup> The woman was the last to die. <sup>33</sup> But all seven brothers married her. So when people rise from death, whose wife will the woman be?"

<sup>34</sup> Jesus said to the Sadducees, "On earth, people marry each other. <sup>35</sup> But those who will be worthy to be raised from death and live again will not marry. <sup>36</sup> In that life they are like angels and cannot die. They are children of God, because they have been raised from death. <sup>37</sup> Moses clearly showed that the dead are raised to life. When Moses wrote about the burning bush, he said that the Lord is 'the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob.' <sup>38</sup> God is the God of living people, not dead people. All people are alive to God."

This is the gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, O Christ
