



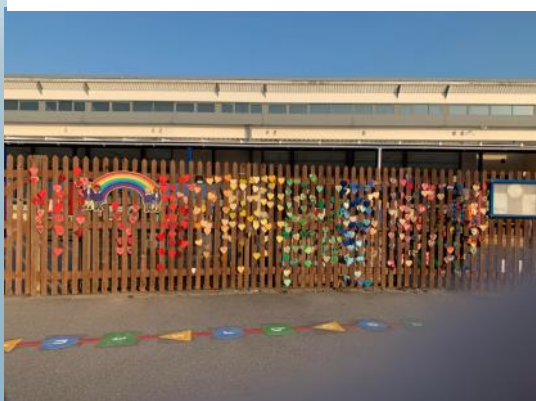

Dear Parents and Carers,

At the start of a new year it's important to stop and reflect.

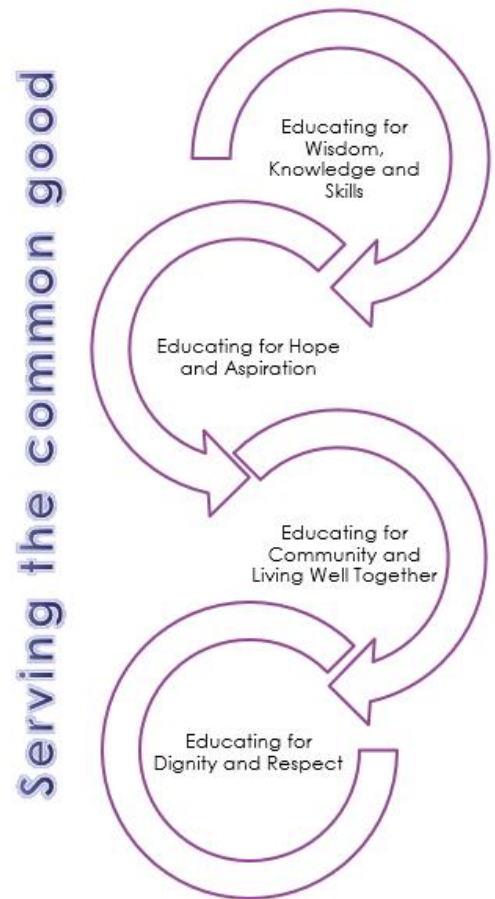
We talk often in school about the Rainbow Promise and Owl learning. This is a translation of our wish for every child to get a good job (using Owl skills) and to get along with their friends, neighbours and families (Rainbow Promise). Our mission is to empower our children to flourish and achieve under God's love because as John 10:10 says we wish to Live life in all its fullness.

Last summer we asked for feedback on your thoughts on how we do these and where to go to next—all survey results were published but we also have been doing some work on our longer term aspirations: The Promises to our children, our staff and to our wider community. These are our Promises to keep to our children to be able to serve the common good with our work as part of the Church of England. We first wrote them four years ago and have based our whole curriculum around them. You will see them on every Jennett's Park Policy, every unit overview and hopefully in how we approach our life.

We have tried to describe why this is important, what we should do as schools and families to enable this. The three main limiting factors impacting education (and possibly most systems) are in tightening budgets limited training for staff, lack of time and money. We promise to positively tackle this at Jennett's Park CE Primary by devoting to have clarity on how to use time, a well-developed training cycle and to proactively find sources of funding.

We have self-rated using your feedback, that of our own data and from conversations and surveys with children what we have achieved thus far and what still needs to be embedded or developed.

I'm fully aware it is a long read and we don't expect everyone to internalise every word. If you are short of time I'd direct you to the bottom of page 4/6/8 and 10 for what families can do to help. 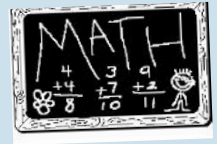
