Do please pass this if you think a child is in danger of not being safe and come see me. You can always send in information in a letter marked confidential to the office if you don't want to share widely.

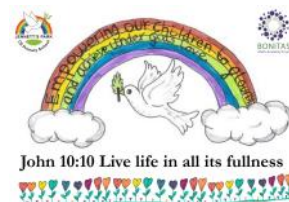

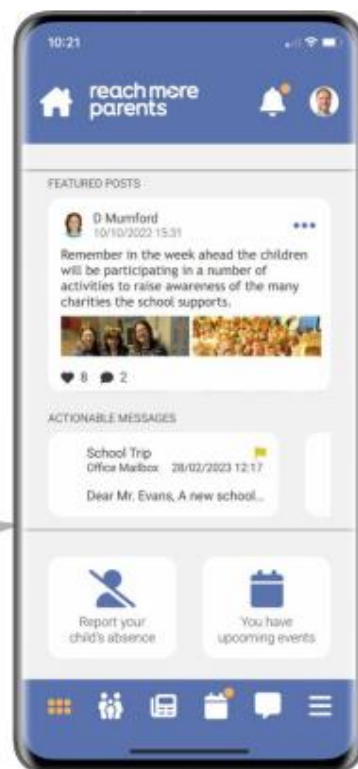

Each week children are chosen for showing Owl learning behaviours or following our Rainbow Promise.

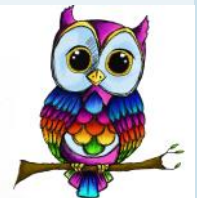
Our Rainbow Promise underpins everything we do

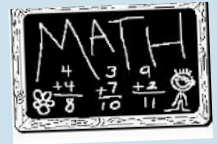

### Short Breaks Service

Provides support, signposting and advice to families of children with disabilities to help them access social opportunities and enable families to have a break from caring responsibilities. There are universal, targeted and specialist services available depending on need.

### Local Offer

Provides information about SEND provision expected to be available locally across education, health and social care for children and young people in the borough who

- have SEN
- are disabled,
- including those who do not have Education, Health and Care (EHC) plans.

### Family Information Service (FIS)

Provides an impartial information and signposting service relating to childcare and other services that support parents and carers of children and young people up to the age of 20 (25 with additional needs).

Works with organisations and professionals who support families.

### Information, advice and support service (IASS)

Provides impartial and confidential information, advice and support about the legal rights of children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) to parents and carers and to children and young people themselves.

### Parent Carer Forum (PCF)

Provides the chance to be listened to and influence partners to design the services that are needed. Bracknell Forests PCF is an independent group which empowers families to access these services and advocates for inclusion for all.

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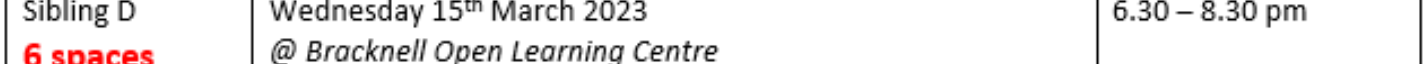

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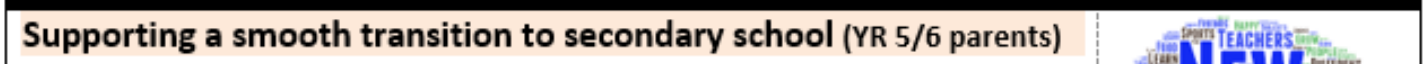
