#### Pride month (repeat of January information for interested parties)

Many often want to have details to help understand our approach. To help answer the questions about any of our content I would always draw your attention to our website and policies. In this case it is our PSHE curriculum and the Equality and RSE policies.

As a Church of England school, Jennett's Park Primary adheres to the 'Valuing All God's Children' (2019) document issued by The Church of England Education Office. This states that part of our responsibility as a C of E school is 'to ensure that no child or young person can leave [...] without a sense of their own belovedness and without being offered honour as a person of divine indwelling.'

We believe that a large part of educating children is to prepare them for life in modern Britain. Without educating children to 'understand the rights of all people to live freely within their sexual orientation or gender identity without discrimination', we would be 'failing in [our] duty to prepare [our] pupils to live in modern Britain.' This document underpins the teaching of RSE and PSHE in Jennett's Park, but also influences our core Rainbow Values which impact on all aspects of teaching and learning. We want within our Rainbow Values to teach children how to get on with one and other as we are all woven together as a community like strands in a fine cloth.

We every year explore as part of our Personal, Social, Health Education work three different topics. Relationships, Health and Wellbeing & Living in the Wider World. Relationship and Sex Education forms part of this work and is a statutory requirement in England.

Within the teaching of the RSE curriculum, it is important that the needs of all pupils are met, and that all children understand the terms of equality and respect (Equality Act, 2010). Homosexuality and transgender, including bullying related to these areas, are discussed at a level appropriate to the age of the children. From Nursery, children are taught to respect the life choices of others within the understanding of the school's Rainbow Values. For our youngest children, this incorporates different types of families, and physical differences between boys and girls. As they progress through the school, children will be taught to respect others' life choices in terms of sexuality, and what this means (see Appendix 3 of RSE policy for the specific LGBT related objectives covered in each year group). Teachers use their own discretion in these situations when responding to children's questioning. We discuss different famous LGBTQ figures and celebrate their stories.

#### What is an Influencer?

An influencer is somebody prominent on a social media platform such as YouTube and Instagram, who have a high number of followers. Influencers share their opinions/ideas and may be paid to advertise/promote products through their account. Whist there are some great influencers, there are some that choose to share their own opinions, which could be misogynistic or racist for example. These opinions can be expressed or interpreted as fact. It is important to talk to your child about the spread of misinformation online and how we should fact check and critically analyse what we see and hear online.

What we see on social media platforms is influenced by algorithms, which predict what type of content we are most likely to interact with. Whilst



#### THE GOSPEL St Matthew 9:35-10:8

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. Luke.

**Glory to you, O Lord.** 35 Jesus travelled through all the towns and villages. He taught in their synagogues and told people the Good News about the kingdom. And he healed all kinds of diseases and sicknesses. 36 He saw the crowds of people and felt sorry for them because they were worried and helpless. They were like sheep without a shepherd. 37 Jesus said to his followers, "There are many people to harvest, but there are only a few workers to help harvest them. 38 God owns the harvest. Pray to him that he will send more workers to help gather his harvest."

1 Jesus called his 12 followers together. He gave them power to drive out evil spirits and to heal every kind of disease and sickness. 2 These are the names of the 12 apostles: Simon (also called Peter) and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; 3 Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew, the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; 4 Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot. Judas is the one who turned against Jesus.

5 These 12 men he sent out with the following order: "Don't go to the non-Jewish people. And don't go into any town where the Samaritans live. 6But go to the people of Israel. They are like sheep that are lost. 7When you go, preach this: 'The kingdom of heaven is coming soon.' 8 Heal the sick. Give dead people life again. Heal those who have harmful skin diseases. Force demons to leave people. I give you these powers freely. So help other people freely.
