

RE: BilinguaSing clubs

We are now taking bookings for the autumn term of BilinguaSing lunch clubs at Jennett's Park CE Primary School.

'BilinguaSing' runs sensory bilingual music classes that stand out from the usual language clubs on offer and our 'On y Va!' and ¡Vamos! ('Let's Go!') programmes are specifically designed for Primary Schools. We introduce languages in a fun, accessible way supporting the children with the key language skills – listening, speaking, reading and writing. The following clubs are available:

Mondays: Spanish club, open for years 1-3. For those children keen to get a head start on learning Spanish before they start learning it as part of the school timetable in year 3.

Tuesdays: Key Stage 2 French club (years 3-6). For older children wishing to learn French, this programme is specifically designed to be compatible with the KS2 languages curriculum.
