
Dear Parents and Carers,


Sharon Girling is visiting school to deliver e-safety training 2-3pm for parents next Thursday 19th October. Please share and attend, it will be an invaluable session.



Update from the Family Information Service

Measles cases are rising across the country, with over 102,000 children starting primary school in England being at risk of catching the disease.

Measles is highly infectious and if left unvaccinated nine out of ten children in an early years setting can catch the disease if just one child is infectious.

Why singing?	How do lessons work?
Singing is fun and makes you feel happy! Research shows that children who sing and play musical instruments perform better academically. Singing can help develop confidence, concentration, memory, and teamwork skills.	Lessons can either be individual (20mins or 30mins) or in small groups of 2 to 5 pupils. Group lessons cost from just £10 per lesson; full details are on the website. Children are taught on a rotating timetable so there is minimal disruption to their classroom learning.
