READY TO LEARN?

Throughout the year, all children in Year 4 will be expected to have the following items in school *every day*.

It is expected that all children in Year 4 <u>read at home at least 5 times</u> a week.

Children will have an opportunity to visit the school library once a fortnight.

THINGS TO REMEMBER...

- Homework. As well as reading every day children should be on TT Rockstars for 15 minutes every school day, Additional tasks will be set on Seesaw on a Friday.
- P.E will be on Mondays and Thursdays. Children should wear their PE kits into school on a Thursday and trainers only on a Monday.

A reminder that children should be reading to an adult at home at least fives times a week. This can be any book, not just a school reading book, but it's important that even those who are 'free readers' are listened to and corrected or questioned.

A reminder also that times tables are an important part of the Year 4 curriculum and your child should login to Times Tables Rockstars (www.ttrockstars.com) to practise as part of their weekly homework.

Our topic continues to be Race to the Frozen North but this term we are focusing on geography and mapping. We will be making maps of the world and charting the routes of well known explorers as well as learning about lines of latitude and longitude, time zones and why not everyone experiences different seasons.
