
Welcome to the Team Ms Flowers and Mrs Gucma-Olejko our new LSAs.

Each course is a **standalone 2-hour session** - please be aware that spaces are offered on a **first come first served basis** and parents should not just turn up



'Christingle' means 'Christ Child' and originates from the Moravian Church. A symbol of Christianity, Christingles are made from an orange decorated with red tape, sweets or dried fruit and a candle. Each of these different elements has a special meaning:

- The orange represents the world
- The red ribbon (or tape) symbolises the love and blood of Christ

• The sweets and dried fruit represent all of God's creations The lit candle represents Jesus's light in the world, bringing hope to people living in darkness
