

Morning drop off Q & A

Why are we trialling a return to coming in via classes?
We think it will be a quicker and smoother start to the day.
Teachers and adults in classes can greet and get things sorted quickly.

Can I come into the class as a parent?

No, whilst that might seem comforting please stay at the door to settle and quickly say goodbye. Smooth drop offs are important to start a day. Be sure to discuss this change with your children.

Will more gates be open?

Yes, the front gate and goodbye gate (near Y4) will be open. We will trial opening the back gate (near MUGA) later on.

Will the gates be open longer?

The front and side gates still close at 9:02. Any late arrivals need to enter via the school office.

Do parents have to drop to doors?

No, from year 3 we expect that they can walk around (you can walk round if you wish). Year 1-2 you may stop at big wooden Dance and Sensory gate to say goodbye if you find this easier.

Can I talk to the teacher/ an adult at a door?

We continue to ask you to save this at the end of day. Only urgent messages should be passed on at drop off. The maths is 30 x 1 minute conversations means 30 minutes. Messages need to be swift or remain as emails or coming to the office to make sure teaching time is maximised and the day begins promptly.


We have included as many as possible but please alert your families that their child's entry may not be on display.




