What can I do at home?

Developing Fine Motor Skills at home

- ⇒ Peeling fruit such as bananas and satsumas.
- \Rightarrow Sprinkling sprinkles onto iced biscuits or cakes.
- ⇒ Filling ice cube tray by spooning or pouring water.
- ⇒ Washing the dishes and wringing out the sponge.
 - \Rightarrow Helping to peg out the washing.
 - \Rightarrow Sorting socks and pegging together in pairs.
 - \Rightarrow Watering the plants using a spray bottle.

Developing Gross Motor Skills at home

- ⇒ Mix cooking ingredients together in a large bowl
 - ⇒ Wiping down a table or counter top.
 - \Rightarrow Sweeping the floor with a broom.
- ⇒ Helping to fold larger items such as towels or sheets.
- \Rightarrow Using a rake to tidy leaves or grass cuttings outside.
 - ⇒ Pulling up weeds in the garden.
- ⇒ Using a large sponge to wash the windows or cars
