Reminders

Coats: If the weather is likely to turn, please remember to bring a coat for your child. Coats should have hoods so children's outdoor play is not interrupted by rain.

Labels: Please remember to keep checking all items of clothing and any bags or bottles are named.

Jewellery: Jewellery should not be worn at school. Please note that only stud earrings should be worn at any time.

Spare clothes: Please provide a change of clothes, just incase your child needs to change at Nursery.

Library: Please bring bags and library books to Nursery on a Monday. Each week your child will bring home a book from school to share with you at home. Arrivals: If the Nursery gate is closed when you arrive, please use the top door bell on the wooden fence.

5 Things To Do At Home to Help Your Child:

- 1. Remind me of the words and phrases that might help me when I am at Nursery. Words and phrases like: Hello. Goodbye. Good morning. Good afternoon. How are you? Please. Thank you. Please can I play? Would you like to play with me? Can I have a turn now please? I need some help. I need the toilet.
- Ask me a little about my day and encourage me to talk about my new friends at home. Encourage me to talk, but don't pressure me. I might not feel like talking right now; maybe try again later.
- 3. Singing Nursery rhymes at home to help develop language skills. These can include number Nursery rhymes like '1,2,3,4,5 Once I Caught A Fish Alive' to help with mathematical language.
- 4. Reading with your child each day and getting them engaged with stories. Some of our story recommendations to help with the transition into Nursery include: 'Goat Goes To Playgroup', 'This is the way we go to school', 'Maisy Goes To Nursery', 'Lulu's First Day' and 'Find Spot At Nursery'.
- Developing your child's listening skills and awareness of sounds in the environment. What sounds can you hear on the way to Nursery and on the way home from Nursery? Can you listen for something louder? Something quieter?
