Winter weather preparations-

So, as I write this on Sunday ready to send Monday there are predictions of wintry weather and indeed more snow. As with any great British weather event it is variable. I am writing now to explain what we do ahead of it as many of you have never experienced this at JP.

1) We are incredibly icy. Slipping and falling is a real risk.

So as we say to the kids walk like a penguin on site... you'll look great en mass.

Entry into school- if the site is safe to open, we may *still* restrict entry via front classrooms and doors / entrance only to reduce risk of breakages. ***Follow directions and please don't argue!!***

2) All children must have enough layers to stay warm. The school is heated well but it is not the same as your house. Children should have coat, jumpers/ new school hoodies, gloves. We also recommend hats/ scarves/ vests and a change of socks /footwear. Slipping on dry footwear is a treat. Children don't keep hold of items so your ***best aim is always to name.***

3) We don't want to close. That is not our wish but if we do the decision is based on staff ability to be in and the safety of all. Staff travel from across Berkshire and beyond. If we close before the start of day we will inform you via email, an alert on 'reach more parents' and the website first, then to update seesaw/ tapestry.

If you don't have access to these, set yourself up - we will not answer individual emails / phone calls as we don't have capacity to do that. The decision is normally by 7:30 but again don't ring/ email as that clogs up communication.

The rule is - ***If you've heard nothing assume we are open.***

4) Please share in Social media groups ***ONLY*** what has come from school as those kindly giving additional speculative details can quickly become misinformation!

If we are closed, you'll know it via the 4 sources above.

5) If we close during the school day again, we'll communicate to you about how to do a midpoint collection safely.

6) We set home learning tasks for children on winter closure days as not everyone can just take the day off/ will have to hybrid work. We know many of you will appreciate something to keep children learning and these will be on Seesaw/ Tapestry by 8:30 if we do close.

So again, happy 2026 and wishing you a wonderful year.
