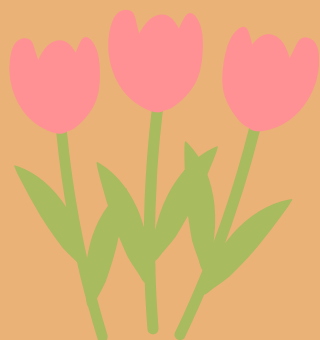

Building a Growth Mindset

We also spend a lot of time talking to the children about the "Zones of Regulation" and how we can ensure we are in our green zone and ready to learn. This helps support the children to develop their self-regulation so they can manage their own feelings and behaviours.

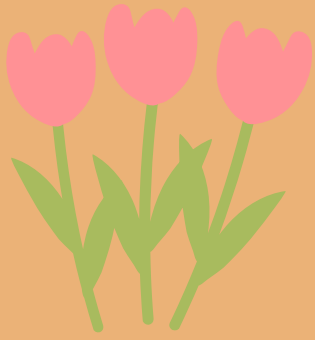
In R.E will be exploring the question 'Was it always easy for Jesus to show friendship?', keeping our focus on the Christian faith for this half term.

In PSHE we will be looking at economic wellbeing - including jobs and careers.

In Music we will carry on following our Sing up scheme of work and will focus on the musical topic of 'Football', where we will explore pitch and rhythm.

In P.E we will continue to use the Get Set PE whole-school scheme to learn about Dance and Ball Skills

In Science, we will be investigating everyday materials such as plastic, fabric, metal. We will be carrying out lots of investigations to test some of the different properties of the materials.



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5 Top Tips to Support Your Child This Half-Term

1. Phonics

Can you teach your sounds to your adults at home? You could use the clips posted on Seesaw to share your learning at home and to be the teacher. Can you introduce a new sound to your grown ups, asking them to read the sounds in real and nonsense words? Could they even write the words and you model 'tick or fix' to support editing your writing?

2.Count in 2s, 5s and 10s

We will be counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. Can you count in 10s as you climb your stairs? Can you count up and back from 0 to 100 using a hundred square at home? Can you count in 2s as you play hopscotch in your garden?

3.Using ? ! and .

Can you use ? question marks and ! exclamation marks within your speech and writing? Can you vary some sentences using a full stop . and then think about how you would ask for information using a ? question mark or showing emotions that might shock or surprise or that you are shouting?! You can! Can't you? Brilliant.

4.Tricky Words

Challenge yourself to create sentences using the red tricky non-phonological words within your reading book. Can you look, cover, say and write these words?

5.Favourite toys

Think about your favourite toys. What is it about them that makes them so special to you? Can you ask your friends, parents and grandparents - if you were to compare using the words 'same', 'similar' and 'different' what do you notice about the toys that different people love?
